The program promotes awareness of higher education through performances from multicultural plays. During this program they provide information on financial aid, the process of applying to the UC system and personal testimonies of attending college. ASF: A Step Forward	ASF was created by FSA as an annual event that introduces admitted and prospective high school students and junior transfers to the college environment of UCSC. It is a three day program that seeks to build social networks with these prospective students and encourage them to attend higher education. Briding Education	Bridging Education was a new one-day program started out of the Commissioner of Diversity office. DHE: Destination Higher Education	Destination Higher Education was created by the African/Black Student Association here at UCSC. The goal of the program is to continue to motivate and expose students to the UCSC campus and encourage them to go on to an institution of higher learning. This is a three-day program that conducts workshops and caucuses to give the students a peer-to-peer college going perspective. ISHE: Inspiration for Scholars of Higher Education	Created by the Hmong Student Association, ISHE is a three-day program that brings high school students to UCSC to explore the college. MC-14: Motivation Conference	Motivation Conference is a three-day program created by APISA that focuses on bring "at-risk" high school students from different community centers to UCSC and engaging with college students.
